Dashboard Overview.



This interactive tool visualises Census data on unpaid care, and unpaid carers' demographics, health, education, and employment, allowing you to compare different regions, local authorities, and time periods.



Navigating the Dashboard

Navigating the Dashboard. You'll find different theme pages.



Unpaid Care – This page focuses on unpaid carers only and shows how factors like ethnicity, gender, hours of care, employment and age are connected.



Demographics – This page provides straightforward statistics and graphs on age, ethnicity, sexual orientation, religion and marital status, allowing you to compare unpaid carers to the general population.



Health – Like the Demographics page, this section provides statistics and graphs on health and disability status comparing unpaid carers to the general population.




Education – This page provides details on the highest education levels achieved.




Employment – This page focuses on Job categories and employment health history for unpaid carers and non-carers.



To make things even easier for you, we have created a "Compare" page. This page allows you to compare different local authorities or track changes over time within the same authority, focusing on unpaid care, demographics, health, education, and employment.



Filtering Your Data.




Each page lets you filter by:

- Local authority – to compare data across different geographies.
- Hours of care – Filter by weekly hours of care provided.
- Year – Compare data over time from 2011 or 2021.
- Sex & Age – Break down data by these key demographics.



You can use the control button to make multiple selections across all filters. For example, you could combine local authorities that make up an Integrated Care Board.



Use the 'i' information icon to view the information box explaining the content presented.

Navigating a dashboard can be tricky for first time users, that's why we offer this introductory [Getting Started](#) page, available on the Centre for Care website, to ease you into the dashboard. We ask that you take a moment to watch the accompanying video that demonstrates how the interface works.

Using the Dashboard

The dashboard presents data for those providing unpaid carers at the local authority across a number of domains. Each page presents data for a different domain and contains a set of filters that allows users to customise their data. Selected filters are carried through into other pages and can also be changed. Filters, along with a description of those selected, can be found in the left-hand toolbar on each page, along with a series of page navigation buttons.

Visuals contained within each page are also interactive. Pressing on an axis or a visual itself filters surrounding visuals. In the event a visual cannot be filtered, owing to lack of data, the output will turn blank and the border red to indicate this feature.

Data and Accessibility

Data are open use and free to download. Some data sources have been created by the Centre for Care and are not available through other platforms. The remaining data are sourced from the 2011 and 2021 census, as supplied by the ONS, and fall under the [Open Government Licence](#).

The spatial nature of the data means that suppression is required to ensure anonymity, though this only affects only a handful of districts. Mapping has been undertaken using Local Authority Districts defined as of 2023. For consistency, we have also included data for districts under the census-defined boundaries. These can be selected as part of the filters. We sincerely hope that you enjoy navigating the dashboard!
